The Master of Arts in Teaching: Elementary Education is designed to deliver outstanding teacher preparation.

Licensure: Upon successful completion of Elementary Education: Licensure degree requirements, candidates are eligible to apply for a Professional Educator License (PEL) with an elementary endorsement from the state of Illinois for grades 1 through 6.

Non-Licensure: Upon successful completion of Elementary Education: Non-Licensure degree requirements, candidates are not eligible to apply for any state of Illinois endorsement.

Pathway 1: Upon successful completion of Pathway 1 degree requirements, candidates are eligible to apply for a Professional Educator License (PEL) with an elementary endorsement from the state of Illinois for grades 1 through 6.
